


## **★ KCLC-ATLANTA ANNUAL**COMMITMENT CEREMONY & MASS



From July 12-14, over 2,300 members of CLC gathered in Strasbourg, France for a powerful congress themed Artisans of Peace. Participants reflected on becoming peacemakers in the world, in their communities, and within themselves. *Lily De León*, a member from South Florida, participated in an open-table interview, sharing insights on political and social realities of CLC globally. Her presence highlighted our region's connection to the broader mission of peace and justice.



#### CLC UNIVERSITY CAMPUS MINISTRY **GATHERING**

#### **Creighton University | Summer 2025**

Campus Ministers and representatives from Creighton University, Loyola Marymount, Loyola Chicago, Xavier University, Loyola New Orleans University, Boston College, Corpus Christi College (St. Mark's College) and the University of British Columbia-Vancouver, met at



Creighton University to share on their respective programs. We explored the history of CLC at the world and university levels, "the power of why" to help with marketing, Magis Circles, the connection between CLC and the Synod, what is constitutive of CLC at the university and MORE! Fr. Jeff Sullivan, S.J. hosted us for dinner at the Jesuit community one evening and we visited an art museum. 
